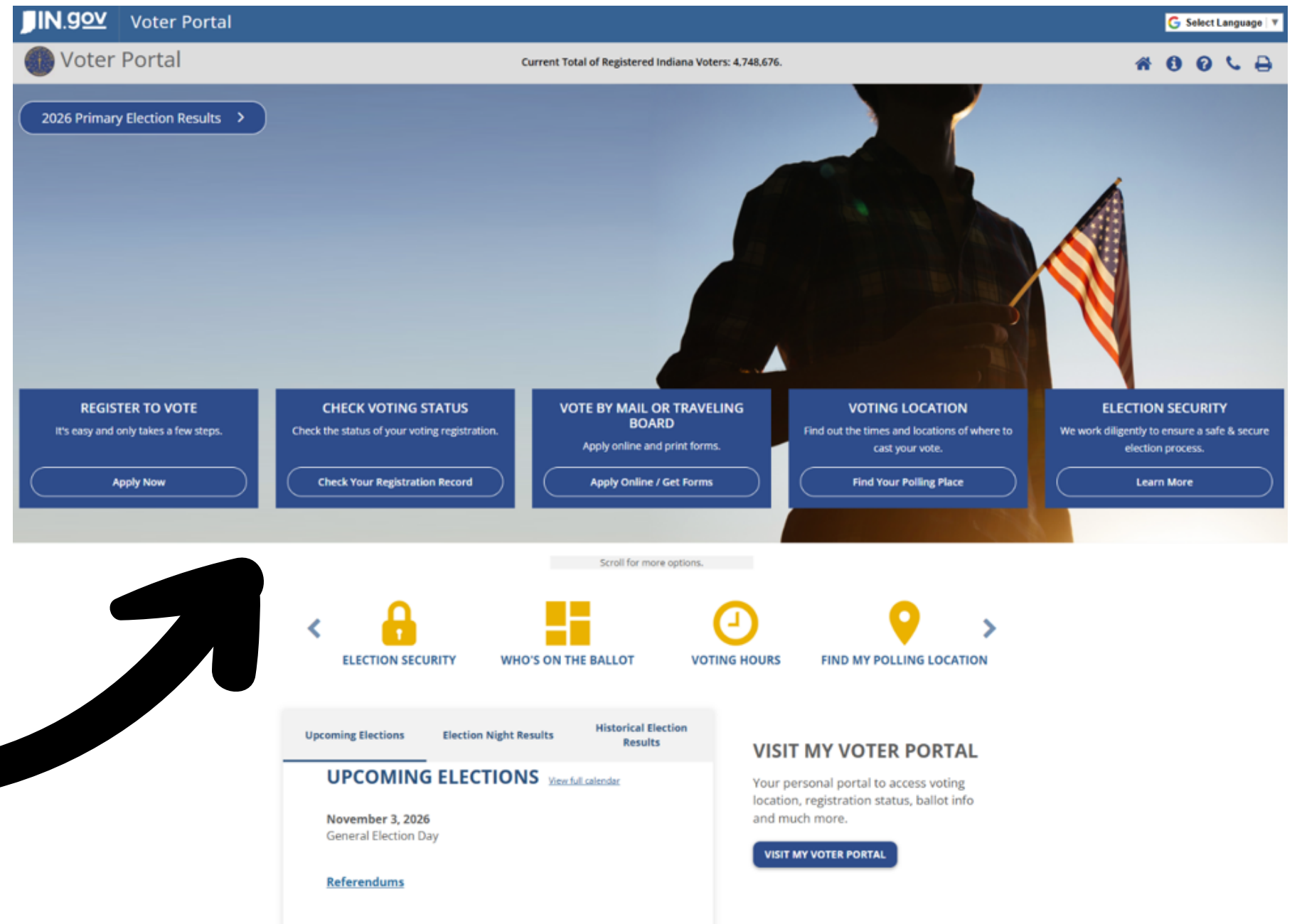

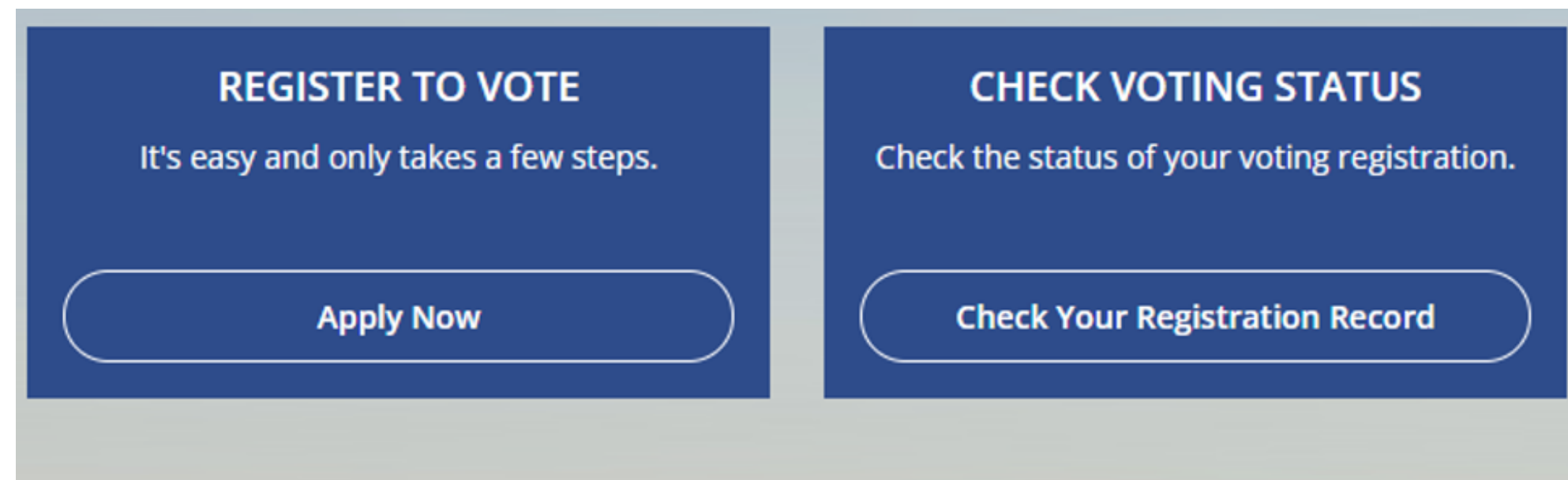
Protect your voter information with two-factor authentication, another way to keep your information secure. Two-factor authentication, or 2FA, is a form of extra protection for online accounts, including your voter information. It requires you to verify who you are in two ways - for example, entering your personal information and a code sent to your email account or mobile number. If a mobile phone number is used, a text message will be sent with a code for you to enter before accessing your information in the voter portal (standard message and data rates may apply). Alternatively, if an email address is used, an email will be sent with a code for you to enter.

Two-Factor Authentication is not an option for voters who register without providing an Indiana Driver's License or Identification Card issued by the Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles. If you choose to submit a new voter registration form and include your Indiana Driver's License or Identification Card, you will be able to enable Two-Factor Authentication.

TWO-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION FUNCTIONALITY IS OPTIONAL.

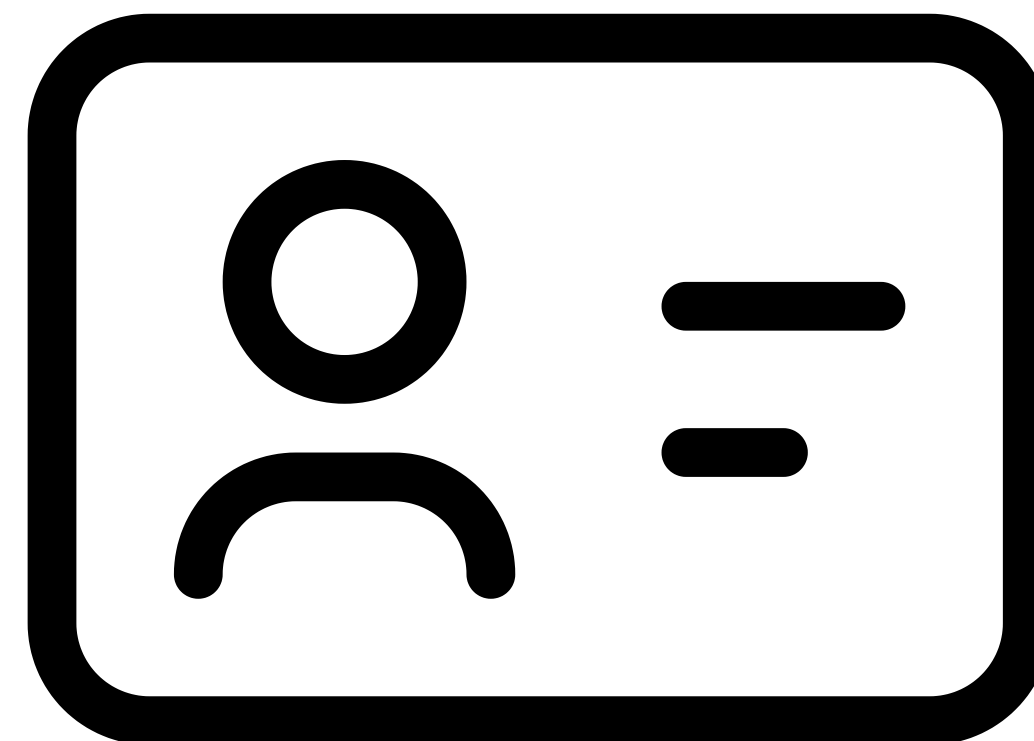

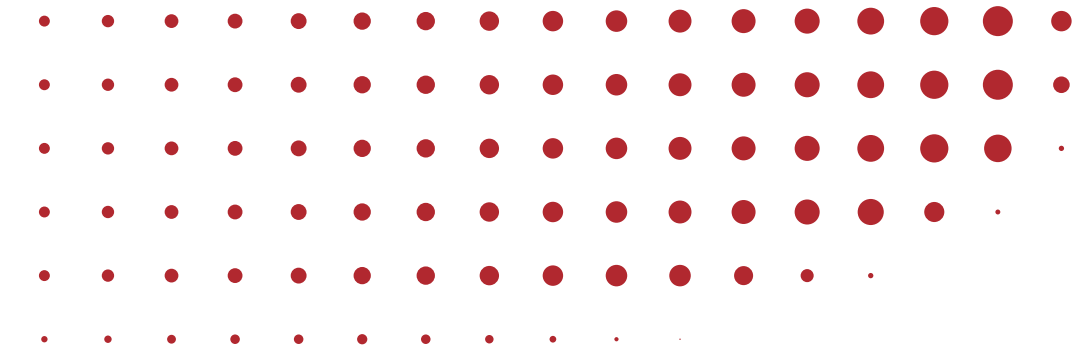

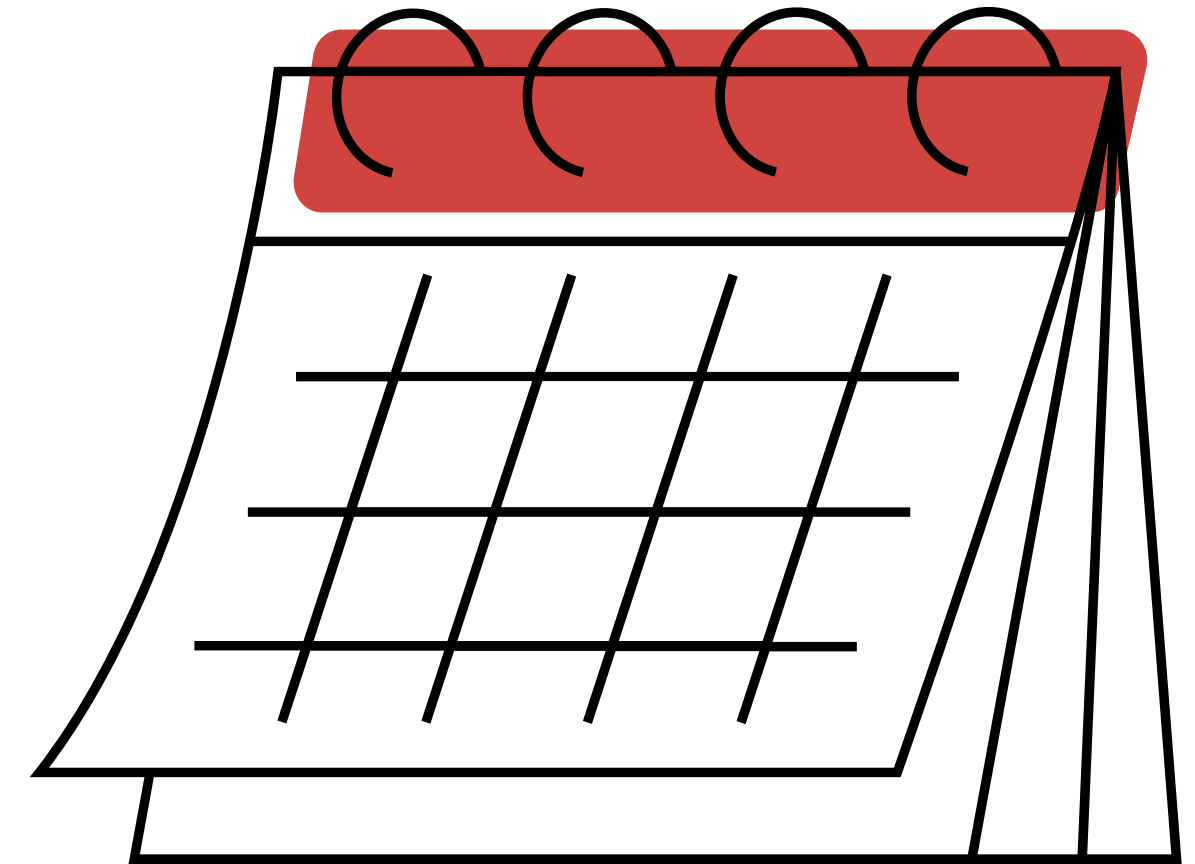
Who can vote in Indiana?

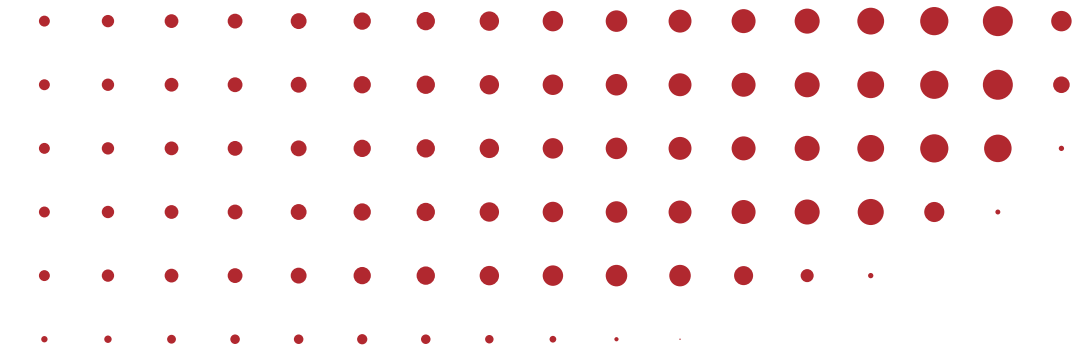
- You are both a U.S. citizen and a resident of Indiana; and
- You will be at least 18 years of age on or before Tuesday, November 3, 2026; and
- You are not currently in prison after being convicted of a crime; and
- You have lived in the precinct where you vote for at least 30 days prior to the election; and
- You are registered to vote.

IMPORTANT DATES

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- **October 6th, 2026 :**
Early Voting Starts (General Election)
- **November 3rd, 2026:**
General Election Day
Polls are open from 6 am-6pm





What to Bring to the Polls

- **A valid ID for voting purposes**
 - **Voter name (must conform to what is on your voting record)**
 - **Includes a photograph of the individual**
 - **Be issued by the State of Indiana or U.S. Government.**

Who and what is on my ballot

The results below display the Federal, State, and local government candidates who will be on your election ballot. The list of candidates is supplied and maintained by the Indiana Election Division and your county election board. *This information is updated daily. If this information appears to be incorrect or incomplete, please contact the Indiana Election Division or your county election board. This information may be incomplete if viewed more than two months before an election due to ballot certification processes.*

Under Indiana Law, if the voter wishes to cast a ballot in a primary election, the voter must request a ballot for either Democratic party candidates or Republican party candidates. Only the names of the Democratic candidates will appear on the Democratic party ballot. In some cases the name of the office for which no candidate filed will not appear on the candidate list. The results below display the candidates who will be on your election ballot.

A 17 YEAR OLD MAY REGISTER AND VOTE IN THE PRIMARY ELECTION IF THEY ARE 18 ON OR BEFORE THE NEXT GENERAL OR MUNICIPAL ELECTION. IF A PUBLIC QUESTION WILL BE VOTED ON, IN THIS PRECINCT, THE VOTER MAY REQUEST A PUBLIC QUESTION ONLY BALLOT.

School Board candidates with a Party Name displaying as “()” have declined to declare a party affiliation when filing candidacy paperwork.

The party sort order is determined by which party won the Secretary of State's race in your county in the last election.

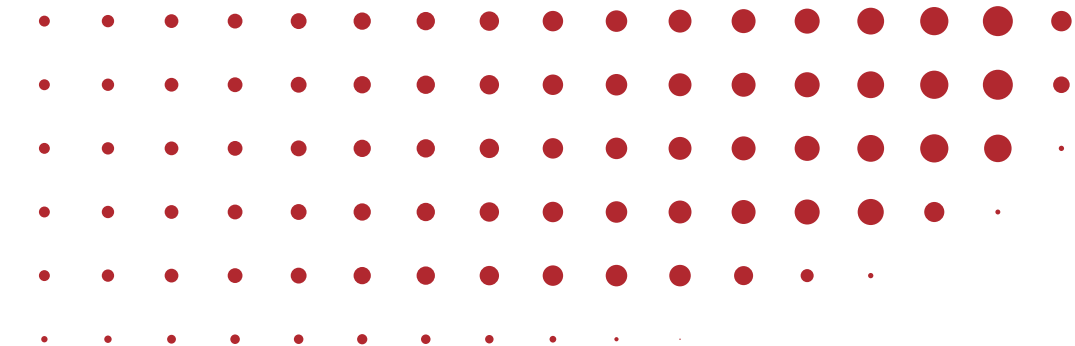

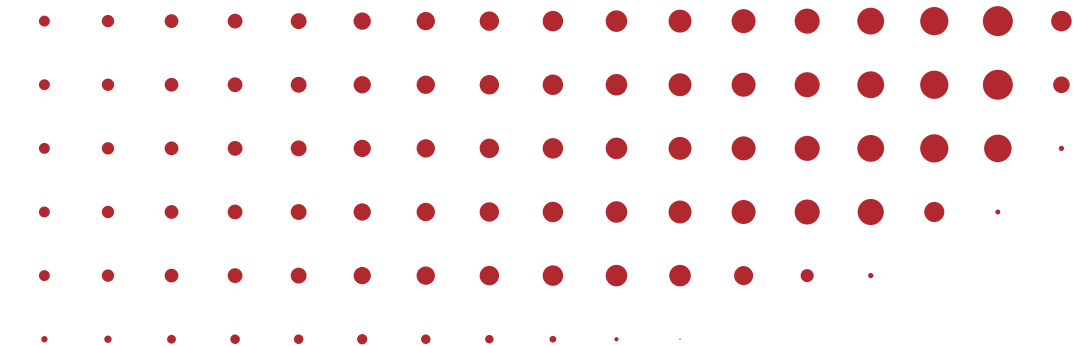
IN A PRIMARY ELECTION, A VOTER WHO IS NOT YET 18 IS NOT PERMITTED TO VOTE ON A PUBLIC QUESTION.

Category	Title	Question
RATIFICATION OF STATE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT	PUBLIC QUESTION #1	CURRENTLY, UNDER THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF INDIANA, A PERSON CHARGED WITH MURDER OR TREASON IS NOT ENTITLED TO BE RELEASED ON BAIL IF THE PROOF IS EVIDENT OR THE PRESUMPTION STRONG. SHALL THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF INDIANA BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON CHARGED WITH AN OFFENSE OTHER THAN MURDER OR TREASON IS NOT ENTITLED TO BAIL IF: (1) THE PROOF IS EVIDENT OR THE PRESUMPTION STRONG; AND (2) THE STATE PROVES BY CLEAR AND CONVINCING EVIDENCE THAT NO RELEASE CONDITIONS WILL REASONABLY PROTECT THE SAFETY OF ANY OTHER PERSON OR THE COMMUNITY. 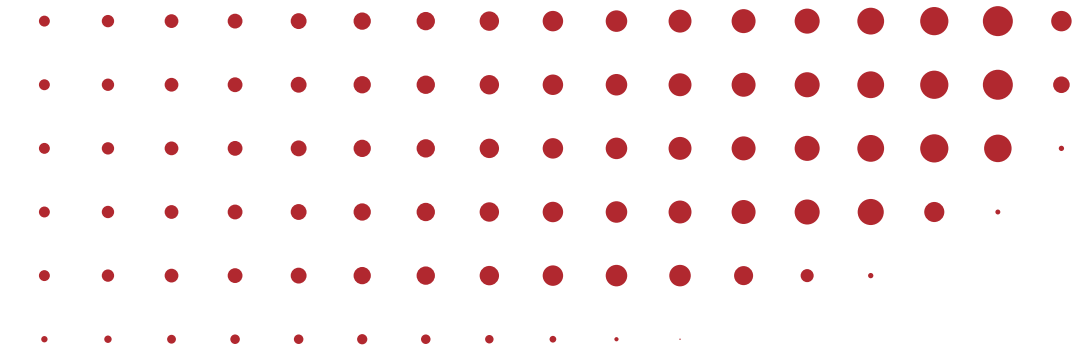
School Board Member

- **4-year term**
- **Members elected from school districts (5)**
- **Members elected at large (2- across all districts)**
- **Governing and managing public school districts**
- **Manages budgets**
- **School property, facilities management, school libraries**



County Commissioners

- **3 Commissioners are typically elected**
 - One from each district in the county
- **Unlimited terms in office (usually 3-4 year terms)**
- **Supervising many county departments**
- **Overseeing construction/maintenance of roads and bridges for the county**
- **Receiving bids and authorizing contracts**
- **Part of “dual executive” body for most counties in Indiana with county councils**



County Auditor

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- **4-year terms at large (across the county)**
- **Can't serve more than 2 terms back to back**
- **Financial manager**
- **Payroll and hiring of county employees**
- **Manages minutes for county council**

INDIANA STATE CONSTITUTION AMENDMENTS

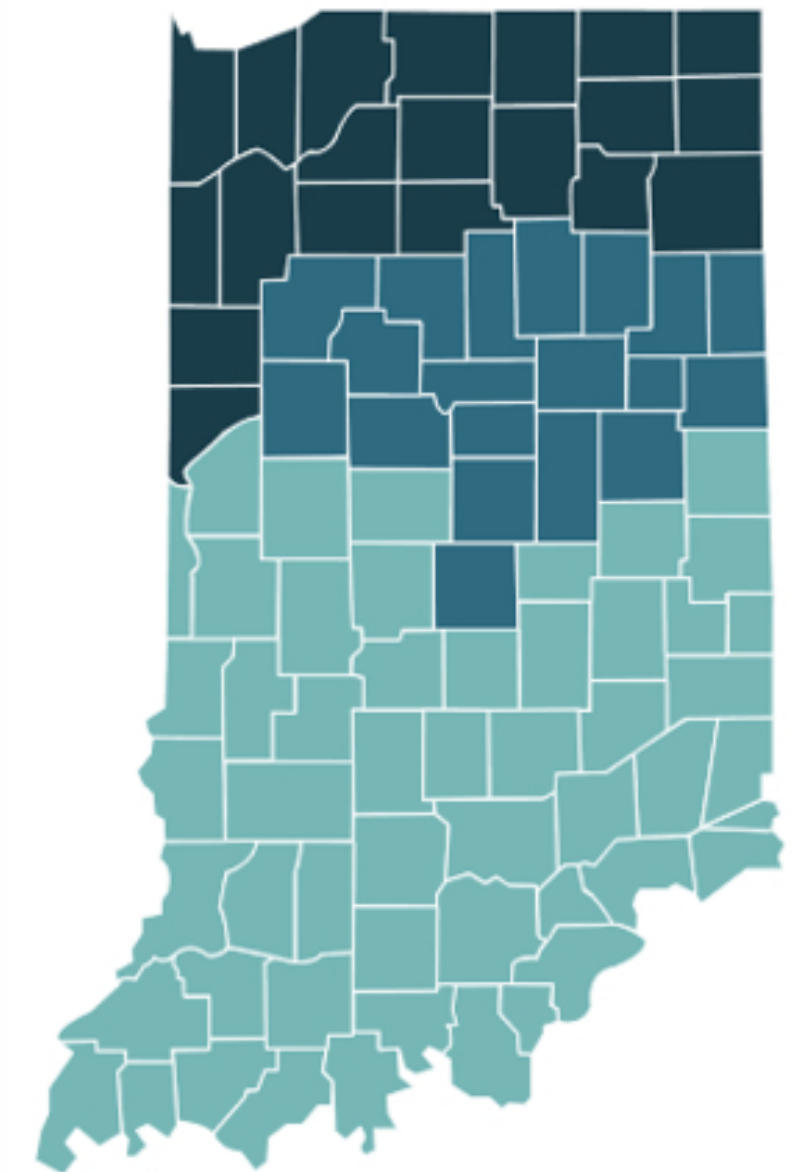
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Retention of Judges

- **Court of Appeals: second-highest court in Indiana**
- **Retention votes at 2 years and every 10 years after**
- **Two retention votes up for the 4th & 5th districts, cover the whole state.**
- **One is for the tax court.**



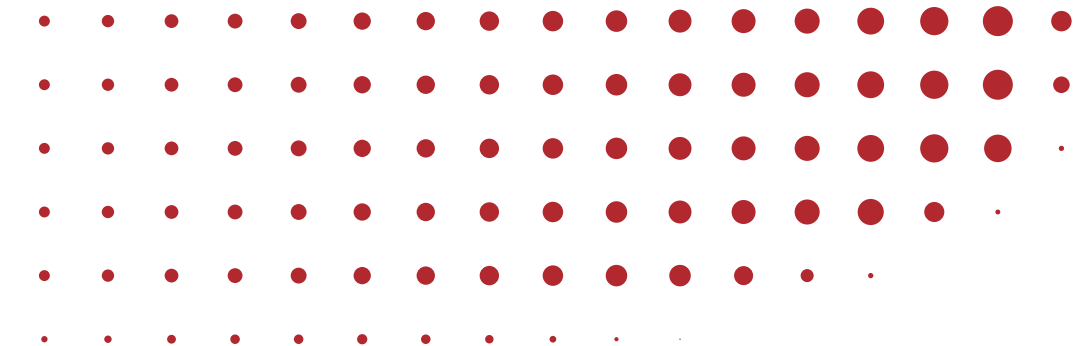
LEGEND

Important Final Notes

- **Don't do electioneering !**
 - **Don't display your support or opposition to a party/speak on vote intentions at polling.**
- **Absentee Ballot -Additional Notes**
 - **Voter or caregiver of a person who expects to be confined on election day**
 - **Voter who is disabled believes polling place is not accessible**
 - **Voter physically unable to complete ballot and sign**
