





 Insufficient net worth to subsist at the FPG for three months in the absence of income.




FPG 2009= \$22,050 Annually Monthly Income= \$1,838 Three months at FPG= \$5,514



- Extreme asset poverty is the measure of households with zero or negative net worth
- Together, asset poverty and extreme asset poverty measures reveal how leveraged and vulnerable households may be, regardless of their earnings.





Asset Poverty

- Job opportunities, wages, and incomes have declined for Indiana's working families
- Poverty and asset poverty rates have increased
- More people are living in poverty today than in 2008
- The full effects of the recession are yet to be seen
