The Self-Sufficiency Standard calculates how much income families of various sizes and compositions need in order to make ends meet without public or private assistance.



IT IS **IMPOSSIBLE** TO BE SELF-SUFFICIENCT WHEN AN ADULT EARNS ONLY MINIMUM WAGE

At the current federal minimum wage of \$7.25 an hour, each adult in a family unit would have to work well more than 40 hours per week in order to meet basic needs without public or private assistance.

Compounding the problem, many minimum-wagepaying jobs do not offer full-time hours, requiring workers to balance multiple jobs and their schedules.
