


## Indiana TANF Grant Has not Increased to Meet the Growing Cost of Basic Needs


Cash assistance benefits have far less purchasing power than in 1988, as the cost of basic items have increased and benefits have lost more than half of their value to inflation



How has the cost of personal care and household items changed since 1988?

<b>Infant diapers</b> 66 count box	\$24.99 \$9.99 1988 2021	150%
<b>Toilet paper</b> 6 rolls	\$5.98 \$1.39 1988 2021	330%
<b>Laundry detergent</b> 42 oz	\$6.72 \$1.99 1988 2021	238%
<b>Shampoo</b> 15 oz.	\$2.98 \$0.69 1988 2021	332%
<b>Children's decongestant</b> 24 count	\$6.79 \$2.99 1988 2021	127%
